Background

- 1. The Welsh Government introduced a requirement for Town & Community Councils to produce an annual report
- 2. The reports are to be produced as soon as reasonably practical after the year end
- 3. The format of this report follows the guidance given by Welsh Government .

Governance

- 4. Taff's Well and Nantgarw (TWNCC) is made up of 10 Councillors who attend meetings of the Council on a monthly basis.
- 5. Throughout the month the Clerk is in contact with both the Chair & Vice-Chair but decision making is the responsibility of the Council.

Community Engagement

6. Meetings of the Council are held in the Community Hub & every effort is made to accommodate residents wishing to attend meetings, either remotely or in person.

Finances

7. In 2024-25 the financial performance of the Council was as follows:

- 8. The report on the 24-25 accounts includes an explanation of the variances from budget .
- 9. In April 2024 the Council increased Council Tax by 5% in recognition of the increased running costs of the Community Hub, particularly the escalating energy costs. Subsequently, RCT agreed to waive the rent charges.

Objectives & Achievements

- 10. Achievements in 24/25 include:
 - Financial support to local organisations in order for them to continue to provide a broad range of activities enjoyed by the community
 - Financial support to the Xmas Lights Committee
 - Reinstatement of Xmas Christmas Lights at Taff's Well Park
 - Agreement of a number of projects covering tree planting, installation of benches & a noticeboard
 - Disappointingly, the creation of a weather proof area for reflection at Ty Rhiw cemetery has not been progressed by Rhondda Cynon Taf CBC

The Council continues to provide funding to the Community Hwb, a local charity, to pay for the running costs of the building.

Priorities for 2025-26

- **14.** Completion of a number of projects covering tree planting, installation of benches & a noticeboard.
- 15. Whilst the Council's spending plans exceed its income, a decision was taken to not increase council tax in recognition of the reserves held by the community council & the continuing financial pressures on residents from increases in the cost of living.
